

#### RAR- Early Childhood Connections Partnership

- Family Coaches who speak the language
  - RAR built into Home Visiting program
- Community Partners to translate books and paperwork
- RAR is mandated into the state funded preschool program (GSRP)
  - With higher percentage of foreign language speakers RAR utilizes translated and wordless books into classroom sets



#### Mindful Practices in Translations

- Confirm that books translate well
- Damaged books are donated to families, churches, and other community org.
- Allow space for families to talk about the books in a picture walk fashion
- RAR National allows some books to be purchased in bulk to translate
