# **RAR COVID Response and Recovery Overview**

#### **Stage 1: Recognition** (Mid-March)

Goal: Establish a common understanding of the problem and potential impact

- Recognize that there is a problem that is impacting our communities, program delivery model, and could impact our business model
- Understand the full scope of the problem, and impact on: staff, our supply chain, affiliate host organizations and families.
- Communicate with affiliates, advise them follow county guidelines



#### Stage 2: Immediate Actions (Mid-March – Mid-April)

Goal: Take immediate action to support affiliate network and activate relationships with stakeholders

- Close warehouse and move all staff to remote work
- Develop and launch Affiliate communications plan:
  - Host weekly Town Halls with affiliates and send weekly email
  - Build COVID -19 webpage with curated resources
  - Survey network to assess for current status, needs, and loss
- Connect with peer organizations and begin to share resources and collaboration points



Stage 3: Contribute, test concepts (Mid-April – end of April)

Goal: Support affiliate network, fill in gaps, and ensure sustainability

- Continued outreach to affiliates including cohort calls
- Seek crisis funding: Apply for PPP and EDIL; national and restricted funders
- Support crisis response with books (First Book) and emergency kits (Parent Child+)



#### Stage 4: Build our Future (End of April – May)

Goal: Rebuild our model and expand our offerings to meet community need, taking advantage of new opportunities and partnerships

- Engage NALAC in ideation of implementation model
- Execute future decisions on:

Opportunities to expand the model to meet demand/need

- Building on bag rotation and library connection
- Digital learning/ technology, possible content development
- Book only, summer learning and transitions
- Expanded content

Expand marketplace offerings for affiliates, technology partners

- Book only collections, manipulatives



# Phase 2: COVID Recovery

Stage 1 Conclude & celebrate	Goal: Formally conclude 2019-2020 Program Year
Stage 2 Sustain Routines	Goal: Support families in sustaining the routine of book sharing over the summer and support addressing "COVID slide"
Stage 3 Gather the facts & plan	Goal: Audit your RAR inventory, connect with implementation sites regarding their county guidelines, plan for relaunch incorporating appropriate RAR implementation alternatives (rotation, techology, parent workshops, library connection)
Stage 4 Relaunch	Goal: Re-launch your Raising A Reader program serving children and families
Stage 5 Refine	Goal: Assess and refine innovations

#### **Goal: Formally Conclude the 2019-2020 Program Year**

- Determine your programmatic data requirements
  - Connect with any funders or institutions to determine their expectations. Most are trending towards not requiring formal outcome data.



#### **©** Program Surveys

- ★ Administered via existing phone, virtual meeting, text or email
  - ☐ Phone/Virtual Meeting: Q&A to complete survey
  - ☐ Text/Email: Provide survey questions on an online platform
- → RAR recommends that you select 3-5 questions from the standard Pre/Post or Retrospective Survey.
- → Other data may also be used such as:
  - Number of children, classrooms, sites served
  - Overall satisfaction data from children, families and Implementers
  - ☐ Anecdotal data

- School Librarians love the Blue Library Bag since it helps protect books from their collections.






## **Library Resources**



  - Mathematics Concepts
  - Science, Technology, Arts, Engineering
  - Social-Emotional Development

## Formally Conclude 2019-2020 Program Year

Audit Your RAR Inventory

Goal: Audit your RAR inventory and implementation sites to plan for launch

- ✓ Assess and Inventory RAR Materials
  - Decide if you are going to collect the bags that are out in the field or not. While we highly recommended collecting the bags if you're able, the decision is yours.



# To collect bags from the field you may consider:

- □Aligning with end of school year processes and protocols, and collect red book bags and books
- □An incentive to return the bag or exchange the red book bag with books that they can keep at home
- □Connecting with critical needs providers to set up drop off points for red book bags and books
- ☐ Hosting a "Red Bag Retrieval" campaign when schools and centers reopen (Opening times TBD)

- ✓ Determine your loss and material needs; an approximation is OK
- ✓ Map out implementation plan and sites for fall 2020





#### Goal: Audit your RAR inventory and implementation sites to plan for launch

#### **Clean Books**

- Board Books:
  - Disinfecting Wipe
- Kapco-Covered Books:
  - Disinfecting Wipe
  - Will not hurt the integrity of the cover
- Hard Cover Book:
  - Disinfecting Wipe for cover

As studies suggest, books can be 'quarantined' for a period of time to allow the virus to disappear.

A <u>study</u>, published in March in the *New England Journal of Medicine*, showed that the virus "remained active on plastic and stainless steel surfaces for two to three days under the conditions in this experiment. It remained infectious for up to 24 hours on cardboard." A <u>study published in *The Lancet*</u> on April 2 showed "no infectious virus could be recovered from printing and tissue papers after a 3-hour incubation."

Goal: Audit your RAR inventory and implementation sites to plan for launch

#### **Clean Red Book Bags**

- Canvas Bags (purchased before 2017) If you have Red Bags made out of canvas they can be placed in washing machines on the "Gentle" cycle using non-bleach detergent. Remember: Air Dry Only!
- Vinyl Bags (purchased since 2017)
   For our newer bags, machine washing will damage the bag and is NOT recommended. Wash gently by hand using mild soap or laundry detergent. You may also be able to wipe bags down using a disinfecting wipe.

#### Also recommended:

• Dry Cleaning Red Book Bags




